



Subject Area: RE - Curriculum Map

EYFS objectives which lay the foundations for the RE in the National Curriculum

	<p>Know that the word “God” is a name. Know that Christians believe God is the creator of the Universe. Know that Christians believe that God made our world and we should look after it. Know that the Bible is a special book for Christians and has stories about God and Jesus. Know the Bible story of Noah and the Flood. Know the Bible story of the nativity. Understand that the baby in the nativity story is the same Jesus as the man in Bible stories they have heard earlier this term. Understand that Christmas is a celebration of Jesus’ birthday. Know about some of the ways Christians celebrate Christmas. Know stories about Jesus from the Bible eg. The Loaves & Fishes Know the Bible story of “Jesus Welcoming the Children” and how this shows everyone including children are precious to God. Know the Bible stories of Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.</p> <p>Know the Bible story of “The Good Samaritan” and how this teaches Christians to “Love your neighbour as yourself” Know that Christians can talk to God by praying. Understand why Christians celebrate “Harvest time” Know that Christians believe that everyone is precious to God. Know that Christians celebrate a new baby with a special service at church – a thanksgiving or a baptism. Know that Christians try to follow Jesus’ Golden Rule “To do for others what you want them to do for you”. Understand why the cross is special symbol for Christians. Begin to understand why forgiveness is an important idea for Christians.</p> <p>Know that Hindus and Christians believe in different Gods. Know that Diwali is a festival celebrated by Hindus. Know the story of Rama and Sita and why Hindus remember this story at Diwali. Know why the diva lamp is special for Hindus at Diwali. Know about some of the ways Hindus celebrate Diwali. Know that Holi is a festival celebrated by Hindus. Know the story of Krishna and the milkmaid and why Hindus remember this story at Holi. Know about some of the ways Hindus celebrate Holi. Know that Hindus believe that God has different forms – deities. Learn about some of the different Hindu deities eg. Lakshmi, Krishna, Ganesh and what they represent.</p>
