We recognise the importance physical health has on the over-all well-being and academic achievement of all. We aim for our pupils to enjoy and choose healthy lifestyles and acknowledge the importance of adult role-models in this.

Within our PE curriculum, we aim to encourage the children to lead healthy, active lives. Through our broad and balanced PE curriculum, the children develop physically, socially, emotionally and cognitively. They acquire a broad range of skills and enjoy communicating, collaborating and competing with each other, whilst also developing an understanding of how to improve in different physical activities and evaluate and recognise their own success.
